# QHP Website: MFA

Clinigence will soon require MFA or Multifactor Authentication, using a code from a code generator appor sent via email. Further instructions to come prior to go-live.

#### **Tip of the Month**

- July's focus was Asthma
- If your pt sees a specialist outside QHP, make sure active meds are up to date in their record so you receive credit for Asthma Control Med
- ◆ Document any pt refusal for Flu Vaccine—our overall score for Flu Vaccine for Asthma pts is low

#### **Colon Cancer Screening:**

- For a true screening —the patient is symptom free and has not had a positive fecal occult test—the referral goes to the GI team in the clinic and a questionnaire is done with the patient to make sure it is truly a screening colonoscopy they are needing, if they pass the questionnaire then they go to the APP in GI to review and then a case request is put in for them to get the procedure
- New referral type: "Ambulatory Referral for Screening Colonoscopy" can be done by GI or General Surgery
- A positive Cologuard would be worked into the clinic schedule and be prioritized in the scheduling queue.
- If a pt has an ambulatory referral to GI (not a screening), they are seen in the clinic. Ex: anemia, abdominal pain, etc. If a procedure is needed, these pts are placed on a higher priority list than those who were referred for a screening.
